



Caroline and Jeremy Hubert: "Accident led to a cascade of heavenly music"

THE MUSIC WHICH FLOWED FROM THIS BRIGHTON FAMILY'S TRAGIC LOSS

TWO YEARS AGO THIS MAY, 14 year old Declan Hubert stepped into the path of a car while on his morning paper round.

It turned out to be fatal three days later his family and 81 friends watched his life support being switched off. One may think that this

was yet another sad statistic of road death, worthy of a mention in a local newspaper, but far from it - the family of ten, of which Declan was the third of eight children, would say that it was a life just begun.

"This accident opened doors to the heavenly realm for us," says Declan's father, Jeremy. 'In what would almost seem a bizzare twist, this accident has led to an avalanche of heavenly visitations, a documentary film, and a cascade of heavenly music that just seems to stream through Declan's eldest sister, Melissa.

Now Melissa, 21, has released a CD of her songs, and says she wrote its first song, 'Voice in the Choir', in 15 minutes of inspiration while thinking about Declan in front of the piano.

That day – May 6, 2011 started with a 7am call from Declan's newsagent employer with news that there had been an accident: "Declan has been knocked down by a car - but it's probably not serious."

In fact, Declan had received catastrophic brain injuries from which he never recovered consciousness.

And in the two days which followed, as prayers came from all over the world, and the Hubert family's faith soared to believe for a miracle of resurrection, they learned that Declan had CHOSEN to remain in heaven.

While his family kept their bedside vigil, his mother's 13 year old niece was crying and praying in Colombia, South America, but later emailed to say that she had seen an image of herself in heaven:

"I was on some stairs leading to a throne and I saw that I am at Jesus' feet, pleading with him to do a miracle and he looks at me and gives me the feeling that he was saying 'It's not ME' and then he turns and motions to someone to come to me.

He seemed to say, "I've made my choice and I'm happy'

"And I saw Declan coming from the right hand of the throne, wearing a white cloak. He came and hugged me, and looked at me as if saying, 'I have made my choice and I am happy.' And I saw him so happy and felt he was saying he wanted to stay with God."

The family's crisis turned into a celebration of Declan's life: over 1,000 attended his memorial service, where Jeremy told them, "Declan did not die, he life'd" (sic).

The Hubert family believe that a river of life is still pouring into their household as more people come forward to say that they have either seen Declan 'in glory' in a dream or vision, or had a visitation' of him from heaven

And now Jeremy maintains, "The greatest proof of whether heaven is for real has to be the sublimely inspirational and poetic lyrics that can only have their source from the throne room itself. Melissa is as bemused as any 21 year old would be when finding herself at the centre of such a demand for her CDs.

"We all can only wonder at the master plan of our marvellous God, who can bring forth such blessings out of a life well spent."

The loss has also fuelled Jeremy and Caroline's determination to celebrate life at all costs; they have devoted themselves to prolife or what Jeremy calls 'pro-family' work. Involved with the '40 Days for Life movement, they have shared the criticism levelled at those who hold up banners outside Brighton's main abortion clinic. But with other bereaved parents, perhaps they know the value of life more than those who have not had a chance to love their children.

WHY WE NEED TO PRAY FOR THE QUEEN **TO FULFIL HER CORONATION VOWS**

June will mark the 60th anniversary of Her Majesty's coronation as Queen. Will she hold to the pledge she made back then to lead our nation into God's purposes?

THIS FEBRUARY, a remarkable time of prayer took place.

On Wednesday 20 February 2013 there were 12 of us gathered together in Winchelsea, East Sussex, as the Cinque Ports Prayer Canopy, to pray for Her Majesty the Queen.

We believe we're at a defining moment in history, with a new Archbishop of Canterbury, a new Pope and national leadership changes as well as various deeply troubling situations unfolding, with new challenges arising. And now the Queen herself has been

unwell and, most unusually, had to spend time in hospital.

There are growing spiritual and moral challenges together with enemy activity aimed at destroying the deepest Christian roots in this land. So we felt it was more urgent than ever that we pray and discern what God is saying at this time.

We believe this June's 60-year anniversary of Her Majesty's



coronation is a key symbolic time. In June 1953, our Queen was asked, "Will you to the utmost of your power maintain the Laws of God and the true profession of the Gospel?

If ever there's a time she needs our love, support and prayer cover, it's now!

Not only did she promise to do this, but she put her signature to it as well. It's time now for her, as a believer, to stand up and proclaim the truth into the nation.

But we, too, have a duty to show her our support. It's time for us to communicate with Her Majesty our love, respect, and support for her as our Queen. It's vital that she knows we are

praying and supporting her in her walk with God and in leading us, her subjects. We would urge you to write to Her Majesty encouraging her to stand up now and proclaim the Gospel into the nation, without fear of man.

If ever there's a time she needs our love, support and prayer cover, it's now

We currently have the prospect of the same-sex marriage law in Parliament that will have profound effects upon the nation. Believers have been doing their best to make their voice heard by the government; but is it time we also petitioned the Queen not to sign the bill? Imagine the impact if she refused! But of course she has actually

already given the seal of approval to a very similar law in one of the other countries of the Commonwealth: Canada, in 2005.

At our prayer meeting, we sensed God telling us that our monarch regrets putting her name to that law eight years ago. We believe she is coming under conviction about her invidious position as Sovereign, and the actions that she has been 'forced' into as



Queen by politicians, which go directly against the oaths that she swore at her Coronation

If our Queen is to start speaking up and speaking out, there are bound to be consequences, both good and bad. So we urge you to pray for protection for her and her family.

More than ever. Her Majesty needs to know that she has the support of believers in the UK

CINQUE PORTS PRAYER CANOPY

CENTURIES AGO, the original five Cinque Ports - Hastings, New Romney, Hythe, Dover and Sandwich were responsible for serving the king, his noblemen and armies, especially with boats to cross the English Channel. In return, they were given privileges, including helping to carry the canopy over the monarch on the day of their coronation.

Since 2007 a prayer group comprising Christians from across this southeast corner of England, now known as the Cinque Ports Prayer Canopy, has been meeting to pray, as 1 Timothy 2:1-4 urges us, especially for the Queen and all those in authority

We are very aware that one day another coronation will be needed, but nobody knows exactly when! With all the changes, both physical and spiritual, that could be triggered in this nation, the Commonwealth and beyond, the big question is, "Are we READY?!"

Same sex marriage bill 'back in Commons in May'

All but two Sussex MPs in favour of 'equal' marriage

THE GOVERNMENT'S **BILL** to legalise same sex marriage is expected to return to the Commons this May for its report stage.

It has passed through the committee stage and the committee's findings will be reported to the Commons, when parliamentary time, probably two days this May, will be given for the whole House to consider and debate the committee's amendments and any amendments tabled by MPs since the committee stage

Ăfter the debate the Third Reading will be a formality for the Commons to vote on before going to the House of Lords.

A Commons insider told HEART OF SUSSEX that although the Bill is expected to return to the Commons this May, it could happen earlier on the Government's decision. The committee included Conservative MPs David

Burrowes and Tim Loughton. Mr Burrowes, a Christian

and member for Enfield, is the three who took the trouble leading opposition to the Bill in Parliament. Mr Loughton, MP for East Worthing and Shoreham, was one of just two and at short notice, depending Sussex MPs who voted against the Bill at its Second Reading on 5 February. The other was Crawley's Conservative MP Henry Smith.

These men were also two of

to respond to HEART's survey of Sussex MPs on same sex marriage in its May/June 2012 issue. Both MPs have kept to their original stance, although it has been suggested that it cost Mr Loughton his Cabinet post as Minister for Children, lost in last year's reshuffle.

The third was Worthing West

MP Sir Peter Bottomley, who followed the Government's pressure to support the Bill. When he responded to the survey he had not decided how he felt about the issue. Subsequently he has been reported as saying that he is expecting to be challenged before the next General Election.

Campaigners pointed out that the committee also contained a disproportionately high number of homosexual MPs which was not representative of the population as a whole.

The Christian Institute hailed the strong opposition to the Bill as a victory in so far as they had campaigned for a strong 'no'. Director Colin Hart, who had also appeared before the committee, said, "We knew the size of the 'no' vote would be the crucial factor. The media speculated that perhaps 130 or 150 MPs might vote 'no', but 175 did so. That's why newspapers focused on the strength of the 'no' vote, and reported that it was very damaging for the Prime Minister.

INTERNATIONAL PREACHER

Jonathan Conrathe says he has seen "again and again" the blind seeing, the deaf hearing and cripples walking.

Jonathan trained for seven years under evangelist Don Double and is now in his 25th year of full-time ministry, having led 160 mission trips in Britain and overseas, where he has seen thousands make professions of faith in Christ. Now based in Peterborough with his wife and three sons, he travels about ten days a month to preach and runs a ministry training programme.

DIANE ABBOTT: 'PORNIFIED' SOCIETY IS HARMING GIRLS

YOUNG GIRLS are being hit hardest by a "porn version" of sexuality which is sweeping our society, Labour MP Diane Abbott has said. She says girls are being led to believe that "sexiness" is the most important quality in life.

She says parents should be put "back in control" and the high street needs a "detox".

The MP for Hackney North made the comments on the online forum Mumsnet, where she warned of "a very specific form of sexuality that's being imposed on children and adults: a porn version".

She blames factors such as raunchy pop videos, huge billboards featuring sexualised images women, and fast-developing technology. She also raised issues of online bullying including problems around 'sexting', as highlighted by Clifford Hill in his article in the last edition of HEART OF SUSSEX

The MP commented: "For me the key is putting parents back in control, and also putting open-minded family values back in our public spaces.

LONDON BUS ADVERTS BANNINGS

High Court rules that humanist, Stonewall and 'Ex-Gay' bus adverts should ALL have been banned

FROM 1 APRIL last year, 1,000 London buses carried adverts with the slogan "Some people are gay. Get over it!"

Sponsored by the homosexual rights group, Stonewall, they aimed to promote 'equal' (same sex) marriage

In response, Dr Mike Davidson of Christian charity the Core Issues Trust, a Christian ministry supporting men and women with homosexual issues who voluntarily seek change in sexual preference and expression, booked a response advert: "Not s gay! Ex-gay, post-gay and proud. Get over it!

It never made it to the buses because Transport for London (TfL), chaired by Mayor Boris Johnson, banned it

'Highly offensive' adverts

Backed by the Christian Legal Centre, Dr Davidson took TfL to court to seek a ruling.

In a significant High Court judgement, Mrs Justice Lang has labelled bus adverts from the British Humanist Association and prominent homosexual lobby group Stonewall as 'highly offensive' and ruled that they breached TfL's advertising policy.

But she also ruled that the Core Issues Trust's advert also fell foul of the policy – and for that reason was legitimately barred by Transport for London (TfL).

The Judge did, however, allow for an appeal

Serious questions about Boris's role

The judgment provoked serious questions about the part played by London Mavor, Boris Johnson, who was seeking re-election at the time. and contained extensive criticism of TfL's handling of the matter.

There was 'missing evidence from the Mayor's Office', which made it hard for the Judge to establish with absolute certainty the precise nature of Mr Johnson's involvement.

The Judge found that in barring Core Issues' advert, having previously allowed those of Stonewall and the British Humanist Asssociation, TfL had applied its policy "inconsistently" and "partially". She concluded that TfL's decision-making process was "procedurally unfair" and "in breach of its own procedures".

Censorship around sexual ethics

However, in spite of this severe criticism, Mrs Justice Lang found that TfL was right to ban the advert placed by Core Issues in response to Stonewall's campaign.

Reacting to the judgment, Andrea Minichiello Williams, Director of the Christian Legal Centre, which has supported Dr Davidson and the Trust, said:

"This case vividly exposes the huge asymmetry and censorship that characterises public debate at the moment, especially around sexual ethics

"The message that some people are 'ex-gay' should not be considered offensive or controversial. Some people choose not to act on samesex attraction. MOST BRITS BELIEVE IN THE POWER OF PRAYER

Easter has found a high percentage of people believing in prayer.

The new ICM survey offers revealing insights into the issues that are on the hearts of British people and which age groups are praying more than others.

It found that four in five British adults still believe in the power of prayer.

When asked what they would pray for, nearly a third

said world peace, followed by 65s made up the largest an end to poverty.

One in five said they would pray for healing for another person, while 5% said they did not know what they would pray for. Only 14% said they would never pray.

Other subjects for prayer cited in the survey included: my partner, less stress in my life, a prayer of thankfulness, prosperity, guidance, a friend, marriage or relationship, forgiveness and work.

Glenn King's family had a history of heart disease. But Glenn and his wife were determined that it would not affect his ability to carry on working

FOR BUS DRIVER GLENN, it would have been easy to panic when he found he had twice the normal cholesterol levels in his blood. A negative report from the hospital would have spelled the end of his career. Here is his story:

> AS A BUS DRIVER, and due to having suffered a TIA (mini stroke) in 1995, I have to renew my PSV driving licence every three years.

This includes a medical examination before the DVLA will reissue my licence, so it can seem like quite a hurdle because my livelihood depends on a good result.

When I had my latest medical last July, one of the investigations was an exercise test to assess my heart activity. I was duly sent along to Cardiology at Worthing Hospital.

The test results showed up some minor irregularities in the rhythm of my heart and while the DVLA felt these were minimal and issued my new licence, I was advised to get them checked out because my family has a history of heart problems.

Although I've reached 58, my father suffered from coronary artery disease and died of a heart attack at 32 and my older brother had a heart attack and bypass surgery



about ten years ago. So these are the facts in the natural realm, but we have always believed that God wants to supply good health to his children so they can carry out his will on earth.

"I don't know why they've sent you here!' said the doctor. *Your heart is perfect!*

I duly went to see my GP who made the referral to the hospital and I also had a cholesterol blood test. My cholesterol level was found to be above normal at 7 (average should be around 3-4).

However, our God is a God of the supernatural and I had determined that none of these factors were going to affect the level of faith to which

God has called me. My lovely wife Carole and I began to pray about the situation, but we were very careful not to share this with anyone other than our church pastor Coastlands Christian Outreach Centre, Worthing.

In the story of Jairus daughter, Jesus specifically ordered the unbelievers to leave the room! We too did not want to be influenced by any voices of doubt and unbelief while waiting for this hospital appointment: a negative outcome had the potential to affect my whole way of life and ability to earn a living for my family.

On the day of the appointment, 26 February, 1 arrived at the hospital, went into the gents and prayed for a good report from the consultant.

Before I went in to see him, the nurse attached the electrodes. Once in front of him, he looked surprised and said, "I don't know why they have sent you here," to which I replied, "Neither do I!"

He duly checked cholesterol readings and his statement was, "Perfect!"

Carole and I just praised God for his awesome, healing power! If we pray in faith then God is faithful!

If a tiny island community like Cyprus can be treated in this cavalier way by the powerful leaders of the Eurozone, can they be trusted in any of their activities?

HE CYPRUS CRISIS, although only involving a small island, is of huge significance in revealing the depths of the moral as well as the economic bankruptcy of the European nations.

Depositors who had put their money into a bank for safekeeping suddenly found that, far from their money being safe, it was stolen from them in the biggest bank robbery in history!

How and why did it happen? This is a question that ordinary Cypriot residents will be asking for a long time.

For at least the past decade, Cypriots have been aware of the presence among them of wealthy Russians. At the same time they may not have been unaware that Russian oligarchs who have made fortunes since the fall of Communism were using the Cypriot banks to store their wealth

Much of this wealth is said to have been acquired in somewhat dubious circumstances and the Cypriot banks were not very careful to impose conditions which would enable money to be passed on into the international financial system as clean.

The €10 billion bailout

But even more importantly in an election year, Chancellor Merkel could not afford to be seen using German taxpayers' money to rescue rich Russians from losing their "allegedly illgotten gains". As Alex Spillius said in the Daily Telegraph, Cyprus had become "a sunny place for shady people" and it was Russian cash that had fuelled their banks' "disastrous over-expansion".

40 percent cut

The German insistence upon taking at least 40 percent out of the deposits of those holding accounts with more than €100,000 was aimed at punishing the cash-rich Russians

But the whole episode has been so badly managed that it has become a fiasco in which the Cypriot people are the main sufferers, not the Russians. Reuter reports revealed that whilst the banks in Cyprus remained shut and ordinary Cypriots queued at ATM machines to withdraw a few hundred euros and credit A further advantage was that card and cheque transactions were stopped, the rich higher interest rates (six depositors used other means percent) than were available of getting access to their money.

The two banks at the centre

Fiasco

The great bank robbery that was aimed at punishing Russia spectacularly misfired. The rich Russians have long disappeared over the horizon but the bailout fiasco has massively impoverished the whole population of the small Mediterranean island.

It is the ordinary local people and small businesses that are suffering. I have many friends in Cyprus, both English and Greek, and I know a little of the difficulties they are facing. One couple who have a small family business making jams and pickles employing about 20 people face ruin if they cannot pay their suppliers. They are typical of many small businesses on which the economy of Cyprus depends.

Repercussions

The repercussions of the Cyprus crisis go far beyond that island and are likely to affect all the countries in the Eurozone who put their trust in belonging to a community with a single currency that would guarantee its value and stability. People trusted that the money they entrusted to the bank for safekeeping would be carefully guarded and would always be available to them.

But to save the banks from collapse the authorities have stolen money from their

Two men usher in new era of hope for the Church

TWO MEN WITH A 20 YEAR AGE GAP look set to change the world's perceptions of the Church

In just two weeks in March, the new Argentinian Pope Francis, 76, was elected and the new British Archbishop of Canterbury, 56, was inaugurated.

Reactions to both men have been very positive, with thousands turning out to cheer both of them.

Already their words are being reported with an interest and respect more usually accorded to a new president. Many Christians believe the two men are welcomed because, similarly to heros such as Nelson Mandela or Mother Teresa, their integrity and experience give them a moral authority rarely seen in today's politicians.

Archbishop Welby has already spoken out on welfare reforms, as has Pope Francis on the needs of the poor, publicly demonstrated with his continuing tradition of washing their feet as Jesus washed his disciples' feet before his death and resurrection.

Both men will eventually attract criticism for being conservative evangelicals whose biblically based convictions preclude allowing them to approve of 'modernising' that which to many declarations demonthem is sacred, such as choos-

ing when and whether someone lives or dies and the lifelong union of a man and woman.

Pope Francis has already had to deal with criticism of his alleged involvement with Argentina's "dirty war" from 1976-83, strongly refuted by Vatican. Its spokesman, Lombardi, said. "The \mathbf{Fr} campaign against Bergoglio is well-known and dates back to many years ago. The charges refer to the time before Jorge Mario Bergoglio became bishop of Buenos Aires, when he was Provincial Superior of the Jesuits in Argentina and accuse him of not having protected two priests who were kidnapped. This was never a concrete or credible accusation in his regard.

"Instead, there have been strating how much Bergoglio did to protect many persons at the time of the military dictatorship. Bergoglio's role, once he became bishop, in promoting a request for forgiveness of the Church in Argentina for not having done enough at the time of the dictatorship is also well-known.

Pope Francis's election was welcomed by Arundel and Brighton Bishop Kieran Conry who wrote in his pastoral letter to the local churches

'Even the media people in St Peter's Square seemed to be infected by the joy that greeted appearance of Pope Francis, and there is a mood of hope and encouragement across the Church and the world. And pray for Pope Francis. There is a hope that he can re-build the Church as his namesake did, to put it back on track and restore our pride in being Catholic.

"The media have been fascinated by how modestly this man has lived, this son of a railway worker who travelled public transport and by cooked his own meals. Those days are gone for him, but let us hope that our modern world can hear that call to live more simply and modestly. This has been a very timely papal election


According to a report in Charisma News, Hagler looked at the man and said. "Get out of

HEADMASTER and his wife, a primary school teacher, have spent two weeks visiting churches in Cambodia to see for themselves the explosive growth of its churches.

After the horrors of the Khmer Rouge, the Church in Cambodia has grown 70% in 20 years.

Peter and Mary Stewart of Worthing Bible Society Action Group joined ten other delegates from Bible Society UK and Scotland to see for themselves the growth of the church in Cambodia.

"We travelled miles and met some amazing people." savs Peter. "Almost every family in Cambodia lost relations in the horrors of the Khmer Rouge in the 1970s when nearly two million people died. Many teachers died so now many middle aged adults cannot read. We were amazed to see reading groups listening to an MP3 player and following a colourful book filled with biblical illustrations.

"After nearly 16 years of translation work we were able to witness the first oral recording of the Gospel of Luke into Bunong, the language of an animist tribe in the north-east.'

They also met Arun Sok Nhep, "a truly inspirational man, who works tirelessly" and directs Bible Society Cambodia.

Now in his 60s, Mr Nhep says, "God has used the circumstances of my life (pain and suffering) to the benefit of his Kingdom...and an opportunity to now supply scriptures.'

HEN GRAHAME **SCOFIELD'S NEIGHBOURS** see him drive his decadesold Volvo out of the drive of his bungalow in a quiet road in a village near Bognor Regis, they probably never realise that he is heading for the airport as often as he heads for the office.

At 77, an age when other men have retired, Grahame went abroad 15 times last year, jetsetting between countries as a member of that ancient and honourable profession of matchmaker. His arranged matches, however, are strictly business and the introductions are as often as not between governments and business people.

Unlike other international wheeler dealers, though, Grahame derives no personal benefit. For the past 17 years, he has served, very actively, as a member of the International Christian Chamber of Commerce (ICCC) and been an International Director for the past 11 years.

The ICCC aims to teach and encourage people to live out their Christian calling in the marketplace, leading to what they call "a transformed working life," that is, transformed by applying Christ's teaching to their everyday work.

Grahame is now able to live this out through his involvement in Eastern Europe, Rwanda, Burundi and many other nations, and he has brought trade delegations to countries such as Israel.

Interviewing Grahame at his home in Felpham, it is clear that he loves this work.

He funds his exploits from his career in the chartered accountancy practice which he started 40 years ago and built up to provide services to individuals, businesses, churches and charities. His

wife, Elizabeth, used to say, "He looks quiet but gets involved in some hairraising adventures!"

Grahame is now a widower as Elizabeth died 17 years ago. Elizabeth had a ministry of intercessory prayer and Grahame is convinced she is praying for him in heaven.

Grahame and Elizabeth encountered God together when their first child was a severely handicapped daughter. Instead of losing faith, they gained a new understanding of God's power and purpose which gave them both a much deeper commitment to their God. The encounter brought a different perspective. Tipped to be an industrial high flyer, Grahame gave up his job running a factory and said, "Lord, how can I serve you?

Then began his search for a way to live out "the kingdom life" in the business arena. This led to his starting his own accountancy practice in Horsham, now called Baldwin Scofield.

These days he spends an average of three days a week at the office, having passed its management on to his senior partner, Nick Baldwin, also a committed Christian. This frees Grahame to follow God's leading in linking people, governments and businesses internationally. He presently spends much of the working week at his son's home and is a steadying influence on his four grandchildren.

Thirty years after his spiritual awakening, Grahame discovered the ICCC

"The members of the ICCC work hard," he says, "pay their own travel expenses and physically get up and go to wherever they can make a difference in the world."

The leaders and members of ICCC, he says, believe that as you pray, things change. "They use their skills. talents and ability to serve freely. Part of our witness is that as you serve the



Lord, he does not leave any other area unattended," comments Grahame.

"Think about how you'd operate if the banking system collapsed"

Perhaps he is thinking here of the way, with much prayer, his daughter has been transformed from someone of very limited understanding and ability to someone who has a very good sense of who she is and can care for herself. She is now increasing in capacity, runs her own house, goes to the same church, St Mary's Felpham, and is his best friend. He is fulsome in his praise of Bognor's L'Arche Community which supports his daughter.

Although a capable administrator who has also served as the ICCC's

International Treasurer until this March, Grahame's special subject is speaking on "End time" economics. Quietly radical, he offers his listeners a blueprint of how to handle "these coming conditions of intense disruption in world affairs, the 'birth pangs' before Jesus' return and rule," forecast by Jesus himself in Matthew's gospel.

It is a great joy to Grahame that in these challenging times he can offer solutions. To do this, he says, "You have to walk with the Lord, listen to him and live a holy life"

Thus he and his ICCC friends have asked God for opportunities and believe that, in response, God has opened doors in high places of government and brought about change in whole nations through their work.

The President of Burundi, for example, was passionate about educating the children in his country, but did not have experienced teachers. He asked if ICCC might help develop an education system for his nation.

Following lots of prayer that the Lord would help them find people who could develop an education system for a nation, a Christian University in the USA was identified with a specialised education division. A joint venture with Burundi is in the process of transforming the African nation's education system.

On another occasion the ICCC approached the Government of Israel and asked if they could bring trade delegations from some nations who were not trading with them. After prayer, the ICCC members were guided to four of the least favoured nations: Rwanda . Burundi, Liberia and Benin.

Trade Agreements were made under

the watchful eye of Israeli TV.

Each one had a Christian President and each was a pariah state which relied on international aid and UN troops. Israel had the technology and ability to help these nations and formal

Grahame chuckles as he remembers helping the Israeli chef de protocol roll out the red carpet at 6.30am for the unexpected arrival of the Foreign Minister of Burundi who was to be Grahame's responsibility during the visit. "What flag is it, do you know?" asked the anxious chef de protocol. Happily Grahame did.

He explains how they have been active even in China, whose government wanted to develop an entrepreneurial culture, something entirely new for them. The ICCC made a proposal along with other commercial groups. Their suggestion was to use examples of people who had been successful entrepreneurs around the world and develop teaching videos based on interviews with them. It was called,

This appealed to the Chinese who selected the ICCC's proposal, saying "OK, but you can't quote Jesus or the

The ICCC then asked if they could

"Yes," replied the Chinese, "because people will think it is Confucius!

Ten different videos were made. These were taken up by Chinese Universities and tens of thousands of students underwent this training in how to think like entrepreneurs. As a result of the programme, Grahame,

says, "They reckon that 50,000 businesses were started. It was then taken up by the Chinese army to retrain conscripts and finally is being sold in book shops."

The Chinese said, "This is not a business training, this is a new way of life." Grahame has just returned from the


ICCC International General Meeting which took place in Israel in March. What is his advice to us for the future?

"If you are in a tsunami, then get to higher ground, in the spiritual sense. Listen to the Lord and not your own fears. Keep resources where they will not be in the first area of attack (for example, businesses should consider putting money into different banks). Spread your resources out. Think about how you would operate if the banking system were to collapse.

"Learn the perspective that God is in charge and put your expertise to his

GOD IN THE MARKETPLACE

The latest in Roger Greene's series of business success stories...

Letting God run your business!

When stress from my dishonest boss brought on blindness, I said to God, "Why don't you heal my eye as a sign that you're going to give me a good job?"

Last issue Roger Greene introduced you to railway expert Robin Hirsch and his amazing story of dedicating his business life to God. We pick up his story in Frankfurt, where he was Finance Director at an American company's German branch. Here he had already seen miraculous order brought to the real mess of its accounts system after settling old bills, but worse was to come...

My personal experience of healing

Three months into my time in Frankfurt, the European HQ appointed a new Managing **Director. He avoided controls** on his expenses and installed a scheme to deceive an insurance company. Then he told me to write off a 4.8 million DM debt from the local tax books, but to keep it unreserved in the shareholders' accounts. I refused. "That's fraud," I told him.

With the stress, I got gastritis and went partly blind – a big black hole in the centre of vision of my right eye, which matched the black hole in the accounts

The specialist diagnosed clouding of the eye's vitreous body. "It is incurable and will worsen with

age," she said. Meanwhile, I was wrestling with God.

"Now, I want you to resign," I thought he said. "Why?" I asked. "You've only just brought me here and I've no other jobs lined up – and, with your help, I've done so well!"

"Ah, but now I want you to depend not on your great qualifications or track record, but only on me. Don't worry; I'll get you another job. 'Do not resist the evil man.'

On Monday, I resigned. On Wednesday, I panicked.

"God, is the new job you promised another senior position?" I prayed.

Then I had a brainwave: "Hey, why don't you heal my eye, as a sign that you're going to give me a good job?' On Saturday, when I woke up, the

black hole was gone! All that was left was a faint ring. Next Monday, I was invited to interview for Chief Accountant at Sun Alliance Insurance, a post I eventually accepted.

God can manage every aspect of our life better than us: if we trust him, he can and does do miracles. Some I have seen were manifestly supernatural: blind people saw, legs were lengthened, cysts melted away. Others were 'coincidences' but as William Temple said, "When I pray, coincidences happen, and when I don't, they don't."

Running a business under the Holy Spirit's guidance

Seven years later, I was a highly paid consultant with AT Kearney. At a dinner, a man prophesied that if I resigned (again!) and went to Eastern Europe to proclaim the good news that God creates biblical miracles today, I would be blessed spiritually and financially.

I felt this prophecy was true, and so it proved. My visit to Eastern Europe led to my setting up a new company, Kingdom Technology, determined to run under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

It is harder to run a company under God's guidance than to be faithful to God as an employee, because one takes more decisions. For example, none of our leads come by our own efforts: we merely respond to those that the Lord provides. Only once in 22 years were we without work, for six months.

Once, after giving a friend our news. I was surprised to receive a £1,000 invoice from him. He felt he had given

me billable HR advice, though he had not mentioned it. I paid him double, saying it was "a coat and a cloak". In a day or two, a £10,000 invoice that we had written off was unexpectedly paid. God always outdoes our generosity!

Several times, God has prompted me to drop all I was doing and wait for something new. Sure enough, important commissions came along: the first. a book about best practice in the Kowloon-Canton Railway (it sold 2500 copies); the next, a major escalator review for London Underground (they say that the strategy from our work will save half a billion pounds).

So listen to God; don't cling to yesterday's miracles. Then you will be ready for the next thing he gives you to do. It may be even more wonderful.

IT IS WRITTEN in Daniel 2:21

that God not only "changes times and seasons, but that he sets up kings and deposes them."

So when I observe the rise and fall of leaders and governments I am compelled to ask: what's God up to? We may not understand his moves on the geopolitical chessboard of the Middle East, but what we can be assured of, is that we are witnessing

In Syria, the rebels still fight hard against Assad's forces. The UN states that one million Syrian refugees have been created and 90,000 killed. Lebanon is feeling the effects of the Syrian conflict with growing unrest. In Jordan, forces loyal to the king

constantly suppress challenges by radical extremists. In Egypt, the Muslim Brotherhood

is enforcing Sharia law, much to the dismay of those who thought they had won freedom in ousting Mubarak.

In Gaza, Hamas rules with an iron fist whilst flexing their muscles in the West Bank, threatening the Fatah-led

Israel has passed its red diplomatic line with Iran

In considering our response, it's important to measure what we observe through the lens of biblical prophecy; we must see beyond the natural to the supernatural, for what plays out on the ground (in the physical) is often a shadow of things in the heavenly (spiritual) realm. Remember Paul's words to the Ephesians in 6:12: "...for we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against powers. against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. "

Now, perhaps more than ever, it's going to be important to see events through God's Word and not human wisdom

or would, make firm statements; but what was unanimous amongst all the speakers who ranged from senior security advisors to analysts, was that Israel had passed its diplomatic red line and that the US was probably close behind.

The view is that Iran cannot be allowed to become nuclear capable; not just because of existential threats against Israel but the possibility of export to unstable regimes. It was acknowledged that the inevitable retaliatory strike would be severe and Israel would suffer significantly.

The price of oil would skyrocket

Jesus taught us there would be many signs in this earth's last days, both on earth and in the heavens. Acts 2:20 reminds us that, "The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before that great and notable day of the Lord.

Should military action occur we must hold fast to his words – we must not be disturbed, but are to watch and pray.

The global impact could be significant with the price of oil skyrocketing if the Straits of Hormuz, through which passes 35% of the world's oil, become impassable.

Significantly, there is a heavenly sign which might indicate the timing of such an event: in 1949 and 1950, the two years following Israel's great war of independence, there were two blood red moons each year. The same phenomenon happened in 1968 and 1969 following the infamous Six Day War. The next sets are due next year and 2015

These dates have been confirmed by NASA and a detailed exposition can be found on Lance Lambert's website (www.lancelambert.com), which I thoroughly recommend

These remarkable signs in the skies will fall on the first day of Passover in both years and on the first days of the civil and agricultural calendars. If history is about to repeat itself, these signs in the sky could, therefore, herald a war this year. I really hope not.

Whatever happens, we must keep in mind the wisdom of God whose ways and thoughts are higher than ours. We know that God has a plan for Israel. "I will return to Zion, and dwell in the midst of Jerusalem. Jerusalem shall be called the City of Truth, the Mountain of the Lord of hosts, the Holy Mountain... .. I will bring them back and they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem. They shall be my people and I shall be their God in truth and righteousness." (Zechariah 8:4-8).

2013 may prove to be a year in which Christians need to truly follow the advice of the Psalmist, to trust in the Lord in all ways and lean not on our own understanding



THIS IS THE FIRST published children's book by Kathleen Watson, a member of Littlehampton's Arun **Community Church**.

The story begins with its young heroine, Melissa, meeting her elderly neighbour Amy, a Christian. As a result, Melissa becomes curious about who Jesus is. When Melissa reads the book of Bible stories which, Amy gives her, the pictures come to life and Melissa has an extraordinary encounter with Jesus.

When Melissa meets Jesus, she refuses to follow him to the 'house on the rock' because she wants to find her own way there. After rejecting Jesus' offer of help to get there, though, Melissa finds herself in danger.

Messed up and scared, she cries out to Jesus who rescues her. Forgiving

Melissa for rejecting him, he picks her up like a lost sheep and carries her to the 'house on the rock'.

After they arrive, Melissa gets washed clean in a red bath (the blood of Jesus) and becomes a Christian. She then starts going to church with Amy and reading the Bible alongside her Bible story book.

The challenges Melissa faces during the rest of her childhood after becoming a Christian include: praying for her Granny, staying obedient to her mum and her Granddad after they move in with him, peer pressure after befriending Rufus who lives next door to her Granddad and his mate Mick who helps to lead her astray, climbing back up to the 'house on the rock' and accepting Jesus' forgiveness after becoming the lost sheep again and finally sharing her faith with her family and friends.

At the end of her life, Melissa is allowed to see the rewards reaped from all the times during her life when she was obedient to God. Although the book is aimed at

And so to suggestions:

Parental/grandparental attitudes and **example** are of far greater importance than school teaching and the internet.

Arrange parenting discussion groups. If you are unsure how to start, contact Mrs Jacky Clark (email: clucksville@tiscali. co.uk), Mothers' Union parenting coordinator for the Diocese of Chichester (which covers East and West Sussex).

Jacky has a list of trained facilitators who offer sessions exploring all aspects of this most important job in the world; they enable parents to discuss, support each other and gain the confidence to build even greater trust, respect and happiness in their families. Jacky would be very happy to hear from you.

Build a respectful dialogue with local schools. Please understand that schools may well be constrained by dictates of the national curriculum as to content [what and when] and attitude Istraight information to be given without the teacher's own moral values being expressed], and also by staffing ratios. Don't expect withdrawal groups

to be automatically arranged - and remember that if children don't find out the truth from a reliable source, they'll listen to all sorts of rumours on the grapevine/internet. And are there any schools in Sussex which would "deliberately refuse" to talk to parents about these matters? Name them and shame them! Join your PTA and work with the teaching staff.

Type "Bye Buy Childhood" into your internet browser and explore this very informative Mothers' Union site - it's all about the commercialisation and sexualisation of children - and gives things you can do.

Find out from the UKCCIS [UK Council on Child Internet Safety] what work is currently being done to safeguard children. Type the initials into your browser.

Find out from Dr Clifford Hill what positive action will result from his conference and if your MP attended it: www.issacharministries.co.uk. Then tell your MP your concerns.

"I wish I hadn't been born"

I WAS PLEASED TO READ ABOUT the Roev Wade case and Norma McCorvey's change of heart (Feb/Mar HEART OF SUSSEX), but in all the discussions I hear, the focus is always on the feelings of the woman. No mention is made of what would be best for the unborn child.

The desire to be "nice" extends to how the Church responds to other faiths' treatment of children and

On the edge of another move

I believe we're on the edge of another move of God - believers up and down the land have been crying out for it. But unlike previous moves of God's Spirit, this time it MUST go out and not stay in the churches, although we may face challenges from the government and secular

So we will need to have God-given boldness. But most of us only preach one side of the cross, neglecting the other side of the cross explained in 1 Peter 2:21-22: "To this you were called because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should

'He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his

The other side of the cross

The other side of the cross is about denying yourself and taking up your cross every day. That means doing what God wants, not what you want. Denying yourself – your preference to keep your head down - happens every time you tell your friends and relatives about Jesus.

My brother and I led about 100 out of 400 schoolboys at our public school to Jesus. I always knew that the moment we took a stand for Jesus, it affected all their reactions to me.

They'd say, "Jonathan, we like you but can you just stop talking about Jesus." And I'd reply, "No, I love you too much NOT to tell you about him!"

Others were less friendly and would even react violently, knowing that as a Christian I couldn't fight back – but God protected me.

Are we really willing to follow Jesus day to day, devotionally? It's shocking how many Christians don't read the Bible every day. I'm grateful I went to a Baptist church where we were taught to read the Bible every day and pray in our so-called "quiet time" (although it's not so quiet these days!), to



memorise Scripture and speak it out.

MY THREE TIPS

So it's time to get equipped:

GET FIT – physically and spiritually. It's a shame it takes three months to get fit, and only one month to lose it! Get spiritually fit so you're not weighed down not just called to limp along with sin, so keep coming to the cross. We all sin, even as Christians, because when we're tired we make mistakes. And get fit in God by exercising your spirit; I learned to pray in the Spirit a bit more every day, which strengthened me on the inside. Keep opening up to God and receiving from him. Add a bit of fasting, which lowers your resistance to the move of God's Spirit.

DON'T QUIT. There's African saying: "Quitters never win and winners never quit." Hebrews 10:25 talks of not neglecting to meet together. Many towns are said to have thousands of born again believers who are not in church. Worthing is said to have between 3-5,000. Norwich has 3,000. Even if you've been hurt, get over it – we need to toughen up a little. Every time I have to fight criticism and I'm tempted to withdraw and lick my wounds, I read a chapter from Foxe's Book of Martyrs and realise I have it easy!

STAY FOCUSSED.

Hebrews 12:1 talks about running the race with endurance; we need this not just for a sprint, but a marathon. You need to find out who you are and what you're called to and start to function in it. We're as Christians and just make it into heaven. We must be *disciples.* In fact, Jesus was much tougher on his disciples than on the common man. He rebukes them for NOT calming the storm; he doesn't say, "OK, guys, you're still learning...!'

Set targets to your prayer; don't just pray for yourself and your family – focus on others. Pray for a non-Christian for ten minutes every day, then

ask for opportunities to speak to them. Also set a goal to be able to tell one person about Jesus every day. Let's make a resolution that we're going to reach out for God!
